An update on Covid-19 was given. There was updates on where things were at with Hat Daze, the air show, summer rec, and the pool. There was discussion on how the City Hall will look

when we reopen. The committee of Maas and Namken will get together with staff to come up with ideas.

The newspaper has asked if the City would be willing to pay \$250.00 for an ad for the businesses. A motion was made by Namken and seconded by Hanson to approve the \$250.00 for the ad in the newspaper. A roll call vote was taken with Maas, Hanson, Namken, Bies, and Bormann voting in favor and none voting against. The motion was carried.

The County is looking for the approval to put Parcel 31-413-2108 on a public auction. A motion was made by Namken to approve Parcel 31-413-2108 for public auction. The motion was seconded by Hanson. All voted in favor. None voted against. The motion was carried.

There was discussion on spring clean-up. The City will hold spring cleanup, it will just be pushed back and not the first part of May.

There was discussion on doing something for the graduating class of 2020. Schrupp will talk to Nielson.

Enforcement of springtime ordinances was discussed.

The recycling center on the County fair grounds was discussed. Cameras were put up to see those who are dropping off garbage.

A motion was made by Maas to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Hanson. A roll call vote was taken. Bormann, Maas, Bies, Hanson, and Namken voted in favor. None voted against. The motion was carried.
